eBooks within EBSCOhost environment

- eBooks collection available in full integration with other EBSCO databases or in EBSCO Discovery Service
- Mobility
 - Possibility to copy to another devices (such as iPad, eReaders, smart phones,...)
- Available through already familiar interface of EBSCOhost
- Print-out option
- PermaLinks creation for an eBook title or a particular page







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
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


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




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4 Overview of International Business Management

simple environment, where a company's strategies were largely determined by the company itself, with little concern for groups other than its immediate constituencies. The United States dominated this phase of international business. Whereas Europe and Japan were under reconstruction following the war, the United States was powerful and respected. U.S. technology, machines, and consumer goods were in demand around the world. This led to increased exports at first; but then, when foreign trade barriers were imposed, to foreign direct investment. During this period many less-developed countries or LDCs as they were then called were not yet independent, national policies on foreign investment were still being formed, and those national policies that existed were poorly implemented. This gave international companies virtually free reign in their international activities. It was a time when "American management" was considered superior, even though there were many successful European companies operating internationally. Thus, U.S. companies managed their foreign subsidiaries with U.S. citizens, and training for these international assignments was not considered necessary.

Phase 2: 1955 to 1970

This phase consists of three actors: the firm, its commercial constituencies, and the host government. Many international companies had become large by this phase, with globally integrated production and marketing. U.S. multinational corporations (MNCs) were owned, controlled, and managed by U.S. nationals. Concurrently, many LDCs had become independent and sensitive to the potential loss of sovereignty represented by giant foreign corporations. The more developed nations had formulated policies regarding foreign investment and actors were implementing these consistently. These factors combined to make relations with host governments an important consideration for international companies.




EBSCO eBooks App

 - Easily return eBooks to your collection when you finish reading

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




1. Once authenticated to their library, the user reaches the landing page which offers a search box, browse by category, and carousels





Relevance Ranking: Quality & Openness

The system has the following priorities and has no bias toward content from any provider:

- Match on subject headings from controlled vocabularies
- Match on article titles
- Match on author keywords
- Match on keywords within abstracts
- 5. Match on keywords within full text

Value Ranking: Quality & Openness

Currency:

When relevance is equal, the more recent journal articles rank higher

Value Ranking: Quality & Openness

Document Type

In relation to the search terms, document types may be relegated to lower relevance

For example, when the word "book" or "review" is not searched,

there is a "bias" against book reviews,

so these don't dominate results

Value Ranking: Quality & Openness

Length:


Articles of a more substantial length have a heavier weighting (e.g., when relevance is equal,

a ¼ page article is considered less valuable


than a 4 page article)




